

Message to the counselor

This guide was designed with you in mind! We want to give our counselors more comprehensive information about Seward County Community College/Area Technical School in order to help your students make an informed college decision. This guide addresses admissions procedures, scholarships, tuition information, financial aid and other campus life information that we feel is valuable to your students. Please note the index of topics for quick reference of materials.

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Application Process

- Complete the Admission and Scholarship application -online version at www.sccc.edu
 - There is no application fee. The priority deadline for scholarships is April 1st for the fall semester and November 1st for the spring semester.
- Send us your current high school transcript and college transcript if applicable.
 - Upon graduation, your final high school transcript will be required.
- Complete a Housing Contract if you plan on living in student housing.
 - Contracts are available after March 1st in the Business Office and online at www.sccc.edu/students/housing. A \$100 deposit is required.
- Send us ACT scores or sign up for the COMPASS test in place of the ACT.
 - SCCC/ATS does not require an admissions exam. Scores are used for course placement/assessment. Please call 620-417-1042 to schedule a COMPASS test.

Admission Requirements

Seward County Community College/Area Technical School has an open admissions policy. We do not require test scores for acceptance, but do require placement scores for various courses. Certain academic programs may require additional information.

Students who are not citizens are welcome to attend SCCC/ATS, however, to receive in-state tuition rates they will be required to complete an affidavit for in-state residency which can be found in the Admissions Office.

Special Note to Guidance Counselors

In order to make the process of admission easier for your students, we request a final high school transcript with the graduation date and final computed grade point average, even if a sixth or seventh semester transcript was previously sent to SCCC/ATS.

**In order to receive the Seward County Tuition Grant, students must be a Seward County resident and graduate with a 2.0 GPA. This qualifies them for the grant which waves the tuition and students are only responsible for paying the fees. Students receiving this grant must be in at least one campus club or organization and maintain a 2.5 GPA while at SCCC/ATS. The tuition grant is limited to 18 credit hours per semester.

FAFSA

- Obtain a “PIN” to file the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).
 - If you are a dependent student, one parent will need a “PIN” number.
 - To obtain a “PIN” number you may go to: www.pin.ed.gov.
 - If you provide an email address your “PIN” number will be emailed to you in a few hours, if not it will be mailed to you within 10 days.
- After January 1st go to www.fafsa.gov to file your FAFSA.
- Items required to file the FAFSA:
 - Prior year tax returns for parents and student
 - School code: 008228

Scholarships

Scholarships through the Seward County Community College Development Foundation are usually divided between two semesters. All awards and scholarships are renewable. Scholarships require that students attend class and maintain a minimum grade point average. Specific details are available from the Student Financial Aid Office. The priority deadline for all scholarships is **November 1st** for the spring semester and **April 1st** for the fall semester. All applications, transcripts and recommendations must be turned in to the Office of Student Financial Aid by the end of business on **July 15th** in order to be considered for Fall term scholarships.

Presidential Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a senior who is recommended by the counselor with above a 3.0 GPA. Students receive tuition plus books. If the student has above a 3.5 GPA and is selected as a student tour guide, the scholarship is raised to tuition, books and fees. Recipients must enroll in and attend 15 credit hours through 25% of each semester, maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (or cumulative GPA of 3.5 if selected to work in the admissions office) and complete at least 12 credit hours each semester.

The Presidential Scholarship is renewable for the sophomore year for those students who have completed their freshman

year with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 (or cumulative GPA of 3.5 if working in the admissions office) or higher. A renewal Scholarship Application must be completed by April 1st for the scholarship to be awarded for the sophomore year.

Academic

\$1000 Academic Excellence Scholarship

Student must have a 3.5 GPA or higher.

\$800 General Academic Scholarship

Student must have between a 3.00 and 3.49 GPA.

\$600 General Academic Scholarship

Student must have between a 2.50 and 2.99 GPA.

\$400 Academic Incentive Award

Student must have between a 2.00 and 2.49 GPA.

Other Scholarships

Students, following sponsor recommendation, may be eligible for a performance book scholarship, tuition and book scholarship, or a \$1000 and book scholarship, based on their participation in one of the following areas:

Campus Visits

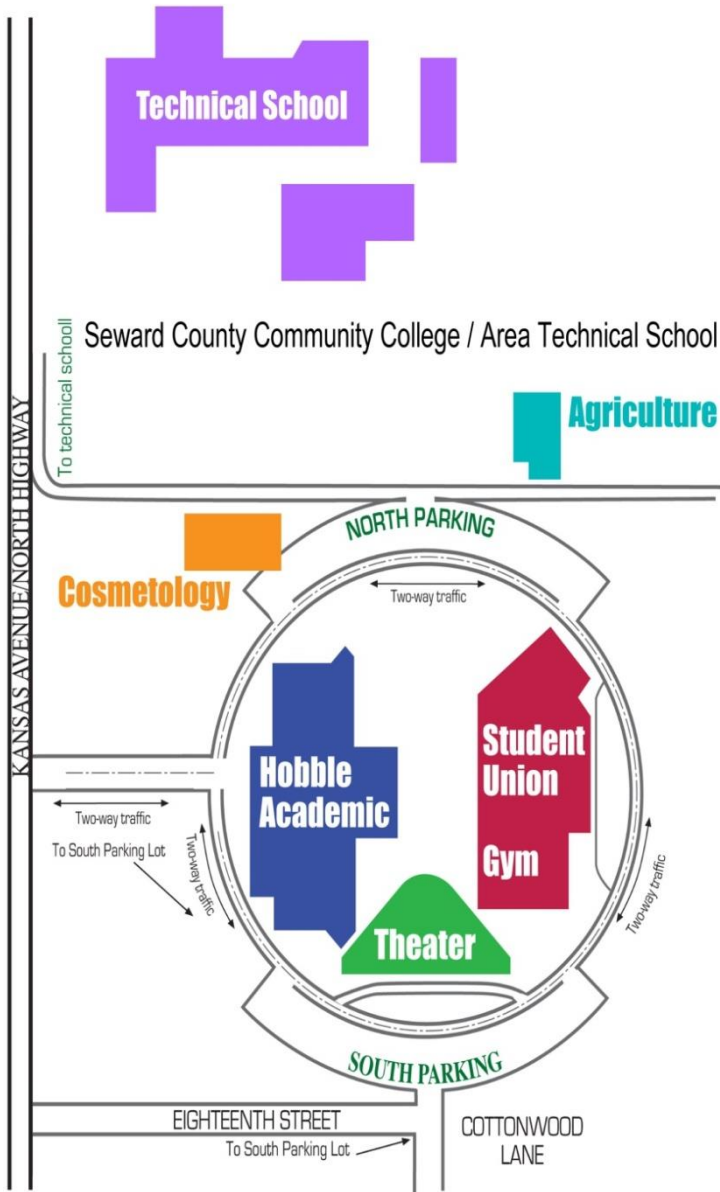
Who: Juniors and seniors are encouraged to visit campus. They are more than welcome to bring parents, siblings and anyone else who would like to take a look around campus. Accommodations can also be made if students are interested in touring in groups. Please allow us 2-3 days to get the tour scheduled with faculty and staff on campus.

When: Campus tours are offered most weekdays from 8:00 to 4:00

Where: Campus is located at 1801 N. Kansas, Liberal, Kansas. Typically, students will start their tour at the Admissions Office located in the Hobble Academic Building; however, the schedule is subject to change. Please refer to map on the following page.

What: Students taking a campus tour should expect to get the full experience of college life at SCCC/ATS. After meeting with the Admissions Office, students will meet with Financial Aid Officers to discuss scholarships and FASFA. Typically, we have current students give the tour of campus including dorms. To conclude the tour, we have students meet with an advisor in the area they are considering majoring in and enjoy lunch in the cafeteria.

Campus Housing

Students at Seward County Community College/Area Technical School are not required to live in the residence halls; however, it is mandatory that students receiving the Presidential Scholarship or academic scholarships live in the dorms. There are some exceptions, for example, if the student is from Liberal or commutes, they will not be required to live on campus. As always, extenuating circumstances will also be taken into consideration. Currently, there is no married or family housing on campus. Please refer to the housing handbook located at www.sccc.edu/students/housing for additional information about resident halls. All housing plans include a meal plan of 19 meals per week; 3 meals Monday – Friday and 2 on Saturday and Sunday.

Requirements for Living in Campus Housing

In order for students to stay in resident halls, a student must maintain regular attendance in 12 credit hours. If a student stops attending class without extenuating circumstances, they will be asked to move out of the resident hall, forfeit their deposit and be assessed a dorm contract cancellation fee.

Application

Students can pick up an application in the housing or business office. An online version is available at www.sccc.edu/students/housing/. Applications will be available after March 1st. A \$100 deposit is due when the application is turned in.

Assignment Procedures

The housing office will hold complete authority to place all residents in units or terminate occupancy. The housing office will try to accommodate all roommate requests in order received. Room assignments in Student Housing are

made without regard to race, color, creed or national origin. The SCCC/ATS, through the manager of Student Housing, reserves the right to change student room assignments as necessary. The manager must approve all requests for changes in room assignments.

Student Living Center: The Student Living Center, the largest of the three areas, accommodates up to 200 students and is a traditional style co-ed dormitory. Two bedrooms with two students per bedroom share one bathroom. Facilities included: computer lab, game room and laundry. Local telephone, basic cable and internet provided.

Full year: \$4,480 double occupancy (Single: \$5,020)
Semester: \$2,240 double occupancy (Single: \$2,510)

Mansions: The mansion suites are two separate buildings that include four-bedroom suites. Two bathrooms are shared by two bedrooms with two students per bedroom. Each has a small commons area. Local telephone, basic cable and internet provided.

Full year: \$4,480 double occupancy (Single, \$5,020)
Semester: \$2,240 double occupancy (Single: \$2,510)

Hale Court: Separate facilities at Hale Court are located at the technical school site. Each building has four bedrooms, one bath per two bedrooms and includes two students per bedroom. Laundry facilities are available. Telephone, basic cable and internet provided.

Full year: \$4,280 double occupancy (Single: \$4,820)
Semester: \$2,140 double occupancy (Single: \$2,410)
